

Third Year Transfer Applicants to Ritsumeikan Asia Pacific University

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I. Third Year Transfer Overview - College of Asia Pacific Studies (APS)

The standard period of enrollment at APU for those who enter as third year transfer students is two years.

(1) Graduation Requirements

If an applicant transfers into APS in their third year, they must fulfill the following requirements in order to graduate:

- Earn a total of at least 124 credits (including credits transferred to APU)
- Earn at least 2 credits from the required subjects for their registered Area of Study
- · Earn at least 28 credits from major education subjects for their registered Area of Study

(2) Points to Consider Before Applying:

It is very important that third year transfer applicants who wish to apply to APS seriously consider whether or not their previous courses can be can be transferred as APS major education subjects before applying. Because the transfer approval process is carried out individually for each applicant based on their previously-earned credits, the graduation requirements, including required courses, major education subjects, and number of credits required, will vary by applicant. In addition, because students can only register for a certain number of credits each semester at APU, it is very important that you carefully consider your study plans in order to fulfill the requirements to graduate in two years.

Please consider the following before applying to APU:

1. Types of Courses and Classes per Week

At APU courses are held on a quarter or semester basis, and most are worth 2 credits each. Quarter courses are held over two months, and semester courses are held over four months. Quarter-basis course lectures are held two times per week, while semester-basis course lectures are held once a week. Language courses have twice as many class meetings as regular subjects.

2. Maximum Credit Registration Limits

APU sets a maximum number of credits that can be registered per semester, so it is necessary to carefully plan your studies in order to ensure you can graduate in two years. The maximum number of credits you can register each semester is as follows:

3. Time for Other Activities

When making your study plans, please be aware that third year students may have limited time to spend on job-seeking, student clubs, part-time work, and other non-study activities. If you wish to seek employment in Japan

after graduating, we recommend that you enter as a second year transfer student instead. In order to find employment in Japan, you will need to devote a certain amount of your time to job-seeking activities in the second semester of your third year and during your fourth year (the 6th through 8th semesters of the undergraduate curriculum), meaning that you may not have time to take as many credits as you will need to in order to graduate on time.

4. Language Education Subjects

If you are entering as a third year transfer student, it is not mandatory to take language education subjects (Japanese if you are enrolling on an English-basis or English if you are enrolling on a Japanese-basis), but you may do so if you wish and if your schedule allows. However, because language subjects require twice as many class hours as regular lecture subjects, it is **extremely difficult to take language subjects simultaneously with your major studies and graduate within two years.** Japanese language study is also highly recommended if you intend on working in Japan after graduation. If you wish to take language subjects, we recommend that you enter as a second year transfer student.

5. Required Number of Credits for Each Area of Study

In addition to the credits transferred as major education subjects upon enrollment, third year transfer students to APS must choose an area of study and earn at least 28 credits from major education subjects and 2 credits from a common liberal arts subject in that area of study.

II. Credit Transfer Process

Step 1: Apply to APU

If you have earned credit for a course similar to one offered at APU, it may be possible to transfer those credits as APU major education subject credits. To transfer credit as an APU major education subject credit, you must submit the **Application to Transfer Credit as an APU Major Subject** form, as well as submit a **course syllabus** for each of the courses you wish to transfer that includes the details of the course in English or Japanese. These documents must be submitted within your online application to APU.

Additional required application documents for third year transfer applicants:

- Syllabus for any courses you have taken or are currently taking that you wish to have approved for credit transfer as an APU major education subject (English or Japanese)

Even if a course is not available at APU, it may still be possible to transfer it as a major education subject credit.

Step 2: Tentative Credit Transfer Approval (carried out by APU)

Third year transfer students may transfer up to 62 credits as major education subjects or common liberal arts subjects. Based on the syllabi and other documents you submit with your application, APU will conduct a tentative credit transfer approval process to determine how many major education subject credits you can transfer to APU. Credits you cannot transfer as major education subjects will be tentatively approved for transfer as common liberal arts subjects. Required language subject credits will also be tentatively approved for transfer at the same time (Englishbasis: 16 credits, Japanese-basis: 24 credits).

The results of the tentative credit transfer approval process will be announced together with your application results.

Step 3: Final Credit Transfer Approval (carried out by APU)

After you submit your final academic transcripts to APU as part of the enrollment procedures, APU will conduct a final review determine the number of credits you will be able to transfer to APU. The final results of the number of credits approved for transfer will be announced to you shortly after enrollment.

The following tables show the maximum number of credits that can be approved for credit transfer:
